In May 2019, she graduated debt-free from Virginia Tech with her Bachelor of Arts in Communication having earned more than \$200,000 in scholarships. In January 2016, Danielle founded Dough 4 Degrees, LLC. Dough 4 Degrees is a scholarship coaching company that teaches students how to earn scholarships to graduate from college debt-free. She established the company after earning over \$100,000 in scholarships during her senior year of high school.

As a student entrepreneur at Virginia Tech, Danielle built a company that connected with students all around the world, earned [investment funding from Marcus Lemonis](#) (CEO of Camping World and face of CNBC's *The Profit and The Partner*), and created a solution to the student debt epidemic. As Danielle continues to grow and scale Dough 4 Degrees, she is building The Dough 4 Degrees Online Academy, an educational resource for students who want to earn scholarships and succeed in life.

In addition to Dough 4 Degrees, she is also the founder of Danielle Jeffers Enterprises, LLC, co-founder of Elite Entrepreneurs Inc., Chief Technology Officer of Auchtoctones Assembly, and a co-founder of the In My Bag Tour. [Danielle Jeffers Enterprises](#) is her personal brand where she publishes books and creates content. [Elite Entrepreneurs Inc.](#) is a training platform that teaches entrepreneurs from all backgrounds how to be elite to increase their bottom line and impact. [Auchtoctones Assembly](#) is a non-profit organization dedicated to raising up indigenous Americans' voices by using genealogy.

The [In My Bag Tour](#) is a commitment between Danielle, [Corey Hackett-Greene](#), and [Kevin Stephenson](#) to give back to their hometowns. In August 2019, the three entrepreneurial [Virginia Tech graduates](#) distributed more than 500 bookbags and 200 teacher appreciation gifts between Danielle's hometown of Danville, VA and Corey's hometown of Philadelphia, PA.
